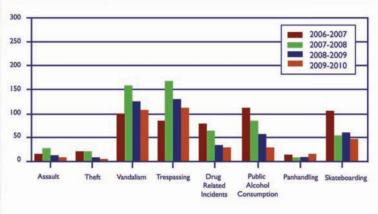

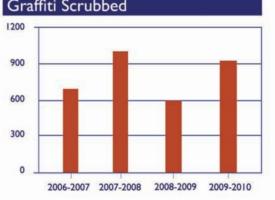

In addition to being extra eyes on the street, the patrol, in their readily identifiable yellow and black uniforms, offer security escorts to downtown residents, workers, students and visitors.

BIA Security works in partnership with the Tacoma Police Department, University of Washington Tacoma Security, Pierce Transit and other private security entities to keep downtown safe.

Security Advisory Committee

The Security Advisory Committee of the BIA meets monthly to address and share security concerns within the BIA. The Security Advisory Committee meetings are open to the public. Security professionals, downtown business and property owners, Tacoma Police Department, Transit agencies, BIA Patrol, and concerned citizens are regular attendees of these meetings.

SecureNet is an email listserve notification system used to alert the downtown community to security incidents and suspicious persons. To be added to the SecureNet please email your contact information to chelseal@tacomachamber.org.

The BIA provides additional maintenance and sidewalk cleaning services within BIA. The BIA Maintenance Crew pressure washes sidewalks and picks up garbage, leaves and debris from sidewalks, gutters, and common areas throughout the BIA at least once per week. Higher traffic areas are cleaned twice per week.

Upon request the BIA Maintenance Crew will also clean graffiti (within arms reach) on all rate-paying buildings in the BIA.

The BIA Maintenance Committee, comprised of BIA Board members and staff meets regularly to oversee the maintenance crew and address maintenance-related issues and concerns.

2009-2010 Results

Debris Collected (tons)

 Removed 33.5 tons of debris from downtown sidewalks and common areas, a 17.75 ton decrease in debris from last year

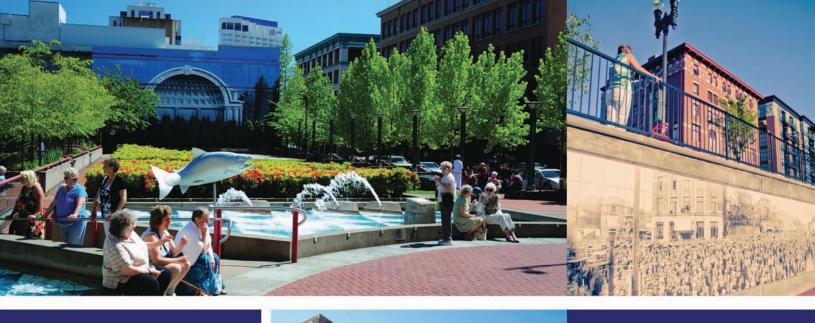
