
Safety Team

Retail Update

2024 saw significant developments shaping downtown's retail landscape. The sale of the Rialto Blocks paves the way for the creation of eight new retail spaces. The Downtown Tacoma Partnership is actively engaged in tenanting discussions to ensure these spaces meet the needs of the community and reflect downtown's evolving identity. Signature events like the 9th Annual Holiday Haul Crawl, which bolstered retail sales during the critical holiday season, highlight Partnership's commitment to driving the economic impact. With the renewal of the Retail Advocate contract by the City of Tacoma, the Partnership remains well-positioned to continue fostering connections, advocating for small businesses, and shaping a thriving retail environment for property owners, stakeholders, and the broader community.



Destination Downtown

Tourism played a vital role in Downtown Tacoma's economy in 2024, driven by a variety of attractions and events that drew visitors from near and far. Concerts at the Tacoma Dome, featuring performances by popular country and K-pop artists, were major highlights, drawing large crowds of music enthusiasts. Additionally, the Greater Tacoma Convention Center hosted numerous events, ranging from professional conferences to fierce competitions in dance, cheer, basketball, and wrestling. These activities significantly boosted hotel room occupancy rates and brought a steady flow of patrons to downtown restaurants, shops, and other businesses. Collectively, these tourism drivers indicate the importance of Downtown Tacoma as a lively destination for culture, entertainment, and economic growth.

Tacoma Dome Events

The Tacoma Dome was a hotspot for **593,926** visitors in 2024 who attended events and concerts by superstars like **Blake Shelton, Cody Johnson,** and **Lil Wayne,** as well as highly sought after two-night performances by pop icon **P!nk**, and country star **Zach Bryan**.



Other Events

Other vibrant celebrations included the annual **Pride Festival**, which brought color and inclusivity to the city streets, and the **Daffodil Festival**, a cherished tradition showcasing stunning floral displays and family-friendly festivities. These hallmark events highlighted the heart and spirit of Tacoma's diverse and dynamic community.



Top Attractions

Downtown Tacoma's top attractions offer something for everyone, from the rich cultural experiences of the **Museum District** and the lively performances in the **Theater District** to the unique finds on **Antique Row** and the craft brews of the **Brewery Blocks**. Together, these destinations highlight Tacoma's rich history, creativity, and community spirit.



Sports Competitions

Sports competitions drew a total of **71,511 visitors** to Downtown Tacoma in 2024 for events like **gymnastics**, **cheer** and **dance** to **basketball**, **karate**, and **wrestling**. Visiting participants and spectators boost the local economy by supporting downtown businesses and restaurants, which resulted in a direct economic impact of **\$16,823,110** last year.



Hotel Occupancy Data

In 2024, Downtown Tacoma saw a hotel room occupancy rate of **58.7%**, with an average daily room rate of **\$174.82**, generating **\$103.24** in revenue per available room. These figures reflect steady visitor activity, emphasizing the area's appeal as a destination for travelers and event-goers alike.

In August, the 2nd annual Downtown Tacoma Block Party was a huge success bringing electric energy to the heart of the city and drawing a crowd of over 8,000 attendees to our free community event where visitors enjoyed all-day live music, family-friendly activities, delicious food, and more. This annual event is devoted to celebrating the vibrant culture and diverse community here in Downtown Tacoma.



Mark your calendar for Friday. October 31, 2025!

On Halloween night, the Downtown Tacoma Partnership introduced its very first Trick or Treat event, which offered families a fun and safe way to enjoy the holiday as the businesses along Antique Row handed out candy and toys to children. Despite the rainy weather, hundreds of people showed up to participate in this exciting inaugural event.

Holiday Haul Crawl

In December, downtown celebrated the 9th annual Holiday Haul Crawl, which is a tradition that encourages the community to shop local for gifts while enjoying free festivities like professional holiday photos at The Pantages Theater, pop-ups at downtown shops, a scavenger hunt to win a downtown staycation, and more. This festive event brought holiday cheer to Downtown Tacoma while supporting local businesses.

Broadway Farmers Market

Visit the 2025 Broadway Farmers Market from April - September!

In spring, the DTP took on the management of the Broadway Farmers Market, which has provided fresh, local goods downtown for over 30 years. This partnership allowed the market to continue to support local farmers, artisans, and vendors while creating a lively gathering space, and ensuring that it continues to be a cornerstone of Downtown Tacoma's culture.

Tacoma Sunday Market

As the managers of Pierce Transit's Theater Square, the DTP was thrilled to host the popular Tacoma Sunday Market throughout the spring and summer months. This bi-weekly market on the plaza became a favorite among locals for its unique vendors and activities, lively music, and welcoming atmosphere.











Featured Downtown Developments



J Squared Investments has breathed new life into the historic **Rhodes Center** at 11th and Broadway in Downtown Tacoma, transforming it into a vibrant hub of activity. This oncestruggling building now features a dynamic mix of office spaces, coworking environments, and a recording studio, with exciting new additions on the way. Upcoming tenants include Kelly's Olympian, Infinite Soups, Intentions Juice Bar, and a new barbershop.



The Rook Apartments at 15th and Fawcett in Downtown Tacoma have redefined urban living as the city's largest apartment development. This impressive project features two eight-story towers with 368 residential units and top-tier amenities, including rooftop terraces, a fitness center, coworking spaces, and EV charging stations. Designed to enhance modern lifestyles, The Rook offers unparalleled convenience and luxury.



Melanie's Park is a new addition to Downtown Tacoma's waterfront at 1147 Dock Street. This playscape provides a vital public green space for the community. The thoughtfully designed park enhances the area's livability, offering a peaceful retreat with stunning views of the Foss Waterway. As an inviting destination for relaxation and recreation, Melanie's Park highlights the importance of accessible outdoor spaces in the heart of the city.



MJR Development has transformed the former Tacoma Financial Center at 1145 Broadway into **Tacoma Centre**, a premier 15-story Class A office tower in Downtown Tacoma. The comprehensive renovation includes modern amenities such as a café and wine bar, upscale lounge, fitness center, and versatile meeting spaces, all designed to foster an appealing work environment. With its strategic location and enhanced facilities, Tacoma Centre sets a new standard for office spaces in the city.

Downtown Residential Developments

Since 2022, Downtown Tacoma has experienced a surge in residential development, significantly enhancing its urban landscape. Notable projects include The Astor, a 150-unit conversion of the historic Washington Building, which opened in June 2022, and the Analog on Fifteenth, which opened in February 2023 with 116 units. Collectively, residential development since 2022 is set to double the downtown area's residential density.

In the last three years, Downtown Tacoma has welcomed over \$485 million in completed projects, including 2,014 new residential units. Looking ahead, over \$655 million is being invested in permitted or underconstruction projects, which include another 2,656 units. This continued wave of growth highlights Tacoma's dynamic transformation and future potential.




